

LONG, LAMBRIES AND CHRISTIANS CLAIM VICTORY AT OUTAGAMIE SPEEDWAY

(Seymour, WI) 6/27/18 Outagamie Speedway race report- A total of 148 cars packed the pit area for Memorial Day weekend. There were 34 IMCA Sport Mods, 33 IMCA Modifieds, 29 IMCA Stock Cars, 18 IMCA Sport Compacts, 18 Street Stocks and 16 Grand Nationals.

Joey Taycher paced the opening laps of the IMCA Modified main with Josh Long, Marcus Yarie and Mike Mullen giving chase. Long was able to muscle his way down low past Taycher on lap 8 for the top spot. Yarie closed in on Long, making the pass for the lead on lap 14. The caution flew simultaneously for debris and scoring went back to the last completed lap. Up against curfew the race was checkered with Long receiving the win. Yarie had to settle for a frustrating second, Mullen was third, Lance Arneson placed fourth and Taycher completed the top five.

Jeremy Christians raced from row 2 to the lead of the IMCA Stock Car feature on lap 1. Travis Van Straten followed suit into the runner up position. Van Straten worked high and low on Christians. With 4 laps remaining, Van Straten dove low entering turn 3, contact was made, sending Christians spinning. Caution flew and Van Straten was sent to the tail. Christians held off a late race charge from Larry Karcz Jr. to score his first win of the season. Karcz was second, Brandon Czarapata took third, Rod Snellenberger and Trent Nolan rounded out the top five.

In IMCA Sport Mod action Lucas Lambries took lead on lap 10 from Jonathan Rothmund. Lambries never looked back scoring a dominating win. Kyle Raddant brought home second, followed by Cody Schroeder, Travis Hansen and Rothmund.

Roger Lee was victorious in the Grand Nationals, taking home the \$600 top prize. Derek Schrauth was second, Tim Simon took third, Jason Fish started 16th and placed fourth, James Pagel was fifth.

Jordan Ross passed Chase Solomon on the final lap of the Street Stock feature to score his second win in a row. Solomon was second, third went to Paul Ambrosius, Alex Crapser started 17th and finished fourth, Kevin Hebbe was fifth.

Al Cottrell lead every lap of the IMCA Sport Compact en route to his first feature win.
